History

Morwenstow is the most northerly parish in Cornwall, covering an area of just over 8,000 acres. The magnificent coastline stretches for 5 miles from Duckpool to Marsland Mouth. The river Tamar has its source at a spring on Woolley Moor.



The most renowned local resident is probably the eccentric vicar, Reverend Robert Stephen Hawker, who was vicar of the Parish Church of St Morwenna and St John the Baptist from 1834 to 1875 and is credited with reviving the custom of the Harvest Festival in 1843. He wrote many poems and ballads one of which is Trelawney, which is often referred to as the Cornish national anthem.

There are many groups and activities of which you can become a part of, either by membership or for free.



2025 saw a programme of events in Morwenstow to celebrate the life of Reverend Robert Stephen Hawker. Among the celebrations was the commissioning and installation of this road sign — complete with Hawkers signature.

Education

Morwenstow boasts a successful primary school (designed by Rev. Hawker) and preschool, with provision for children aged 2 to 11. A free-of-charge stay and play runs on Tuesdays from 09:15 until 10:15 at the preschool.

Walks

Walks in Morwenstow



From soaring majestic cliffs to secluded valleys Morwenstow offers a variety of scenic walks to suit most abilities. The most northerly



parish in Cornwall has strong links to the eccentric vicar the Reverend Robert Stephen Hawker and many of the walks center around his legacy. A fine introduction is the Circular Walk which starts and finishes at St Morwenna's church with parking available next to the tea rooms. Details are available at

More challenging but with spectacular far-reaching views is the South West Coast path from Duckpool to St Morwenna's. Rising steeply as you leave Duckpool the path skirts the coastline offering a wide vistas reaching from Padstow to Lundy. If the tide is favourable why not descend to the beach at Stanbury Mouth where you may find yourself alone even in the height of summer. Car parking and seasonal refreshments are available at Duckpool and Rectory Farm tearooms and of course year-round at the 13th century Bush Inn.

If you are feeling more adventurous the Tamara Way starts in Morwenstow and follows the River Tamar from its source to where it empties into the sea at Plymouth.

Transport

Morwenstow is served by Go Cornwall bus 217 which goes to Bude from Morwenstow (stopping at Crosstown, Gooseham, Shop, Woodford and Cleave Cresent) The journey to Bude goes via Stibb, Poughill and Flexbury. This service does not operate on Sunday and bank holidays. Timetables and other information can be found at www.transportforcornwall.co.uk



There are bus services from Bude to Holsworthy, Camelford, Wadebridge, and Launceston.

The nearest railway stations are at Barnstaple and Okehampton with both providing services to Exeter.

First things to do in the event of an emergency

- 1. Ring 999 to inform the Emergency Services and provide:
 - Clear
 - Concise
 - Actual information as soon as possible
- 2. Contact the plan coordinators
- 3. Meet at the coordinator's assembly point
- 4. When the Emergency services arrive, they will assume sole jurisdiction over the incident
