HAMLETS

The monthly Parish Council meeting was held on Wednesday 19th January 2022 in the Community Centre. Present were Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair), K Boundy, J Payne, J Phipps, R Savage, N Steer, S Tilbey and G Worden, three members of the public and Mrs S Rosser (Clerk). Apologies were accepted from Cllr Jones.

County Cllr. Tilbey outlined his recent duties as Ward member. The overview & scrutiny committee for children and families had recently met. C. Cllr. Tilbey expressed the need to engage with younger members of our community; in order to have their views brought forward, as representation of North Cornwall. A monthly meeting has also been scheduled with Scott Mann.

The lease between the Parish Council and Morwenstow AFC is due to be renewed and extended, for a further period of 25 years. This will enable grant opportunities to be sought and fulfilled by the club.

A Community Grant was awarded to the Cornwall Air Ambulance following receipt of the completed application form. The Grant Policy required a change to satisfy the auditors.

Hamlets were discussed. Quotes are still being sought and other models of publication were explored. Distribution remains a stumbling block. A small number of copies will be printed voluntarily for now; available in the shop for collection, for those who are unable to access online - until a further decision is made.

Platinum Jubilee Celebrations were discussed - various events are planned including: Thursday 2nd June – Bell ringing and Jubilee beacon lighting. Friday 3rd June, Women of Woodford are holding a street party. There will be a further event on the Saturday or Sunday. Details are being confirmed. Five oak trees are to be planted to mark the Jubilee along with red, white and blue wild flower seed mixes sown on the verges.

The traffic proposals that were recently consulted on to reduce the speed limits from 60mph to 40mph, on stretches of Woodford and Shop will be taken forward following the consultation procedure.

A vacancy remains for a co-opted Parish Councillor. Please see the details in Hamlets or visit the Parish Council website for further details.

There were 27 items of correspondence noted. These can be found in further detail on our website.

The Annual Parish Meeting date was confirmed as Wednesday 25th May 2022 – Cornwall Citizens Advice will be attending to give a presentation.

Nine planning applications were received for comment since the last full council meeting in November 2021. Two planning meetings were held on 1st December 2021 and 5th January 2022. PA21/05612 - Proposed dwelling (demolition of existing dwelling), at Killarney Springs, - objection maintained. PA21/10934 - Proposed shepherds hut for holiday use, at Land East of Rectory Farm, Crosstown – objection. PA21/11444 - Proposed manager's dwelling associated with Atlantic Rest Natural Burial, construction of storage shed and provision of new vehicular/pedestrian access, at Land South West of Valley View – no objection. PA21/11626 - Installation of combined septic tank and drainage field to service two dwellings under construction under decisions PA16/07678 & PA16/07677, Land at Lower Woodford – no objection. PA21/12628 - Listed Building consent for replacement windows, at The Old Malt House, Shop - no objection. PA21/10540 - Construction of two storey extension including associated alterations to form additional living accommodation, at Homelea Cottage Woodford - no objection. PA21/12756 - Garden office with overspill accommodation, at The Old Malt House Shop – no objection. PA21/12002 - Proposed Shepherd hut, at Sanctuary Farm, – no objection.

EAST YOULSTONE COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND

Fund Overview:

The East Youlstone Community Benefit Fund, in Devon, has £12,000 available per year for community projects.

The Fund allows groups to apply for grants between £250 and £6,000.

There is one application round each year. The application closing date for 2022 is 16 March.

Project Locations:

Projects for which grants are requested must be located within the eligible area around the East Youlstone wind turbines. You can view the map and check the project location postcode, on GrantScape's website.

Project Purpose:

Priority will be given to:

- Energy efficiency or renewable energy projects, such as insulation, efficient boilers or small scale renewable energy installations.
- Training or education projects, especially vocational training for unemployed young people aged under 25.
- Projects for school age children, or older people.
- Any other community projects for the benefit of residents of the local area.

Eligible Organisations:

Eligible Organisations, who can apply for funding include:

- Voluntary, community groups
- Parish Councils
- Schools and educational establishments
- Social enterprises (including credit unions, co-operatives, social firms, community-owned enterprises, community interest companies and development trusts), provided they operate on a not-for-profit basis.

Applicants are required to have a written constitution, a set of rules, or a governing document and a bank or building society account, held in the name of the organisation, in place before applying for a grant. Organisations that have already received grants from the Fund can apply for further grants each year.
