HAMLETS

The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 17th September 2025. Attended by: Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair) J Phipps, N Steer, J Payne, G Worden, R Savage, C Myers, J Amos-Yeo, S Tilbey, B Savage & Cornwall Councillor F Emery, the Clerk – S Rosser along with the incoming Clerk – J Steer.

A report was given by Cornwall Councillor Faye Emery. This covered various areas including current surveys from Cornwall Council. The Community Chest fund, the Community Area Partnership meeting, and a request for reports of surface water issues - so that they can be addressed. Further details can be found in the draft minutes on the website.

The usual maintenance matters were covered. An increasing complaint received by the Council of late is that both visitors and parishioners have been seen to be using the Playing Fields as a dog exercise area. This seems to have subsided since social media posting however it continues to be closely monitored. Dogs (or any animals) are not permitted anywhere within the Playing Fields or the car park. Please respect this.

The Council are currently in the process of making a bid to Cornwall Council for improvements to the Public Rights of Way (PROW) within the Parish. It is hoped to improve six paths in total. It is also now time for landowners to maintain their road hedges. Please see the notice for further details and signposting.

Much has happened over the summer, including two further planning meetings held on the 6th August & 3rd September, along with the interviews for the position of Clerk/RFO. The successful candidate is Mrs Jayne Steer who will take up the appointment officially on 1st November. Safeguarding training was also delivered to the Councillors; with thanks to Dawn Leighfield. Please look out for further safeguarding work that the Council hope to deliver to the wider audience in the future.

The opening event for 'Morwenstow Active Health' went ahead despite the weather. The MUGA was officially opened by Liam Dart of LJD Coaching. It was a fun event; enjoyed by those who attended. Bookings for the MUGA can now be made via the dedicated website page at: www.morwenstowparish.gov.uk.

Rural verge/hedge maintenance

(information taken from Cornwall Council factsheet).

We are now in hedge trimming season:

Who is responsible?

As the highway authority, Cornwall Council is responsible for the management of growth from the highway verge (excluding the A30 and A38 Trunk Roads, which are the responsibility of Highways England).

Growth into the highway from features such as Cornish hedges or trees on property boundaries is the responsibility of the adjacent land owner.

If growth is causing a safety concern the Council has the power to serve notice on the land owner if an informal approach is not successful. In the event it is deemed a hazard, then the council has the right to remove the growth without notice.

If you are requiring some maintenance to be carried out to your property that may have over hanging tree branches into the road for example; but you don't know who to ask.

HELP TO ACCESS GRANT FUNDING
